**Cost:** We anticipate the cost will be about \$20 for two lunches and \$50 for two lunches, cookout, and bottomless kegger. Pay on the day.



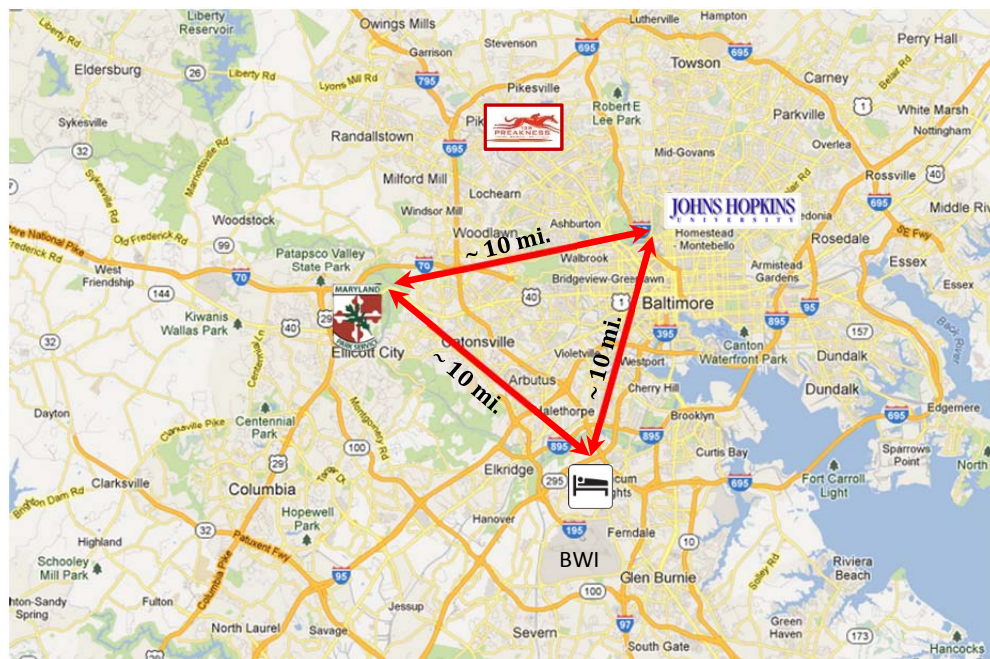
**Lodging:** (1) Camp at Patapsco Valley State Park. Can't beat the price! We have reserved plenty of campsites a short stumble from the cookout venue. We provide the whole deal – get a ride to the park, eat, drink, and be nerdy, pass out under the stars, get a ride back to town. Where the cool people stay.

(2) We have reserved a block of rooms at the Hampton Inn near BWI. This is a 10 mi drive from the State Park. Rooms are \$99 per night – Thursday and Friday – and will be held until May 6.
